Year after year, overdose and suicide have remained the leading causes of maternal death in Colorado and across the United States, which suffers from the highest rate of maternal mortality of any industrialized nation in the world. Compounding the problem, substance use has created significant strain on children's health and the child welfare system. Since 2017, the number of children entering foster care due to parental substance use has increased by 147%. Simply put, substance use and overdose are destroying American families. More must and can be done.

To help birthing hospitals statewide provide equitable access to treatment and recovery for perinatal patients with substance use disorders, including:


- 1. Connection to the patient and family.
