## **Residential Treatment**

**ARTS Reflections for Women** – Denver (near Hampden/Sheridan)

- **Referral Process:** Call main intake line at 303-734-5000, intake staff will set up time to talk to the patient within 1 day. Staff need to speak with the patient directly for about 20-30 minutes to talk through intake assessment, ideal if this can happen in the hospital.

- **Program Information:** 16-bed residential program serving pregnant and parenting women with SUD with children up to 15 months old allowed to reside with the patient during treatment.
- **Wait times:** Varies, often around 2 week wait times
- **Length of Stay:** 30-90 days. Programming is individualized based on clinical needs
- **Insurances Accepted:** Medicaid or Medicaid-eligible only, have to meet medical necessity for residential. Some Signal funding available.
- **Children Allowed:** Yes, babies up to 15 months old at the time of admission are allowed to stay with the patient in treatment. Cribs onsite, but moms need to provide own bottles and formula.
- **Additional Services Offered:**
  - Partner with Sheridan Health Services (FQHC) for medical care including prenatal and postnatal, and contract with doula who will meet with patient weekly if desired.
  - Internal mental health providers available including psychiatric nurse practitioner
  - Lots of groups offered including mental health, seeking safety, coping skills groups, recovery groups, and circles of security parenting group.
  - Work with patients on transitional housing as needed
  - If local, can transport patients

- **Referral Process:** 24/7 phone line for intake assessments: 720-623-0747
  - **Staff Only:** Can email Monica Pineda (Admissions Coordinator) at [MonicaPineda@valleyhope.org](mailto:MonicaPineda@valleyhope.org).

- Program Information: 16-bed residential program for pregnant women and women with children up to age 12. Note: smoking is not allowed for patients at New Directions and cell phone access is not allowed during residential programming. House phone available to residents for certain time periods.
- Wait times: Can take about 30 days to get in, recommend calling daily. Priority populations are pregnant patients, patients using IV substances, and patients experiencing homelessness.
- Length of Stay: 60-120 days for residential including transitional living as needed. Intensive residential program is 60 days.
- Insurances Accepted: Medicaid only, Signal funding available for indigent patients using opioids.
- Children Allowed: Yes, children 0-12 years old allowed to remain with their mother during treatment. State-certified learning center onsite for school-aged children.
- Additional Services Offered:
  - Transitional living services
  - 2-3 groups/day
  - Seeking Safety
  - Parenting groups, biopsychosocial groups

- Referral Process: Call intake line at 303-426-7848
  - **Staff only**: can email Krystal with admissions/intake at kaltman@mhbhc.org
- Program Information: Residential program for pregnant and postpartum women with substance use and mental health challenges.
- Wait times: Varies, currently around 45 days but can do screening right away. Pregnant patients are priority, followed by patients within 1 year postpartum.
- Length of Stay: 60 days, will support patients with finding transitional housing as needed
- Insurances Accepted: Medicaid accepted, Signal funding available for uninsured patients or private insurance in need of financial assistance
- Children Allowed: Yes, up to age 2 allowed.
- Additional Services Offered:
  - Individual & group therapy
  - Case management
  - Peer services
  - Parenting & life skills
  - Healthcare & wellness education
  - Transportation offered

- Referral Process: Email [wru referral@crossroadstp.org](mailto:wru referral@crossroadstp.org) with referral information.
- Program Information: 16-bed residential program for women with 45 days of programming.

- Wait times: Same-day access for residential currently
- Length of Stay: 45 days of residential programming, additional 45-60 days of transitional programming available as needed.
- Insurances Accepted: Medicaid, MSO funding available for indigent patients
- Children Allowed: Yes, children up to age 5 allowed as women's residential center
- Additional Services Offered:
  - Assistance with prenatal appointments
  - Expanding women's services and outreach
  - Parenting, problem solving, baby bonding groups

**Westside Center for Change:** 6303 Wadsworth Bypass, Arvada, CO 80003

- Referral Process: Call main intake line at 303-336-1600 or email [arts.intake@ucdenver.edu](mailto:arts.intake@ucdenver.edu).
- Program Information: ARTS has three Opioid Treatment Programs (OTPs) that provide comprehensive programming for substance use disorders. Pregnant women are prioritized for intakes. In addition to OTP services, they have Office-Based Opioid Treatment (OBOT), traditional outpatient programs, and IOP/EOP programs. Medications offered include: Methadone, Buprenorphine products (Suboxone), Vivitrol, Antabuse, and Naltrexone.
- Wait times: Can do same-day or next-day intakes.
- Insurances Accepted: Medicaid (Health First Colorado), Kaiser Permanente (by referral), Veterans Administration. Private insurance is out of network but can provide "super bills" for reimbursement. State Opioid Response (SOR) funding is available for indigent patients.
- Additional Services Offered:
  - Medical Care Coordinators are onsite and assist with signing up for Medicaid, special connections, Medicaid transportation, and more.
  - Transportation offered by peer navigators as needed for intake appointments
  - DUI Education & Therapy
  - Trauma-focused groups for women
  - Addiction psychiatrist on staff
  - Individual, group, and family counseling
  - Physicians can also prescribe other meds for management of mild health conditions

- Accudetox, Art Therapy, and Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR) therapy offered

- This location acts as a hub and is open from 5:00AM to Midnight Monday-Friday for all methadone and Buprenorphine intakes. This clinic also does 7 day a week dosing for methadone.

- Referral Process: Call or text main intake line at 720-616-0049. This is a 24 hour access line for intakes with a 15 minute response time.
- Program Information: Denver Recovery Group is an OTP providing medications including methadone and buprenorphine for Opioid Use Disorder. Perinatal patient referrals are prioritized. Prescribers available remotely from 0500-2000 Monday-Friday.
- Wait times: Can see a prescriber within 24 business hours.
- Insurances Accepted: Medicare, Medicaid, most 3<sup>rd</sup> party insurance accepted. SOR grant funding available up to 300% of poverty limit with \$10/week copay. Self-pay \$85/week.
- Additional Services Offered:
  - Individual & family counseling
  - Case management services
  - Groups
  - Primary care being added to programs
  - DRG collaborates with over 10 county jails including rural areas of Montrose and Glenwood Springs

- Program Information: Traditional OTP Programming along with a variety of additional comprehensive SUD programming available at Crossroads.
- Wait times: Next day access often available, open access Wednesday & Thursdays.
- Insurances Accepted: Medicaid, MSO funding available for indigent patients
- Additional Services Offered:

- Crossroads also offers women's residential, traditional outpatient, withdrawal management, peer support services, and more.

## **Office Based Opioid Treatment (OBOT)**

**Front Range Clinic** – Over 60 locations in Colorado including mobile sites and telehealth access

- **Referral Process:** Main intake line is 866-645-3095 (relay that you are referring a MOMs+ patient), Fax clinical information to Hospital fax # - 866-441-1033
- **Program Information:** MAT-based provider with counseling and case management services available. Front Range has an extensive network of providers with over 60 locations throughout the state. Buprenorphine/Suboxone and Naltrexone are offered. FRC provides treatment for all types of substance use disorders including opioid, alcohol, and stimulant use disorders.
- **Wait times:** Same day or next day access. Intakes are preferred in person, with a lot of telehealth programming available after intake. For rural areas, telehealth intakes are available.
- **Insurances Accepted:** Medicaid, Medicare, private insurances all accepted, Kaiser is out of network. If no insurance, self-pay rate available based on sliding scale.
- **Additional Services Offered:**
  - Individual, Group, and Family Counseling
  - Telehealth services
  - Case Management
  - Psychiatry services
  - Hepatitis C treatment

- **Referral Process:** Call MAT Line to schedule 720-945-7636 and reference "MOMs+ referral" to be seen by Rebecca Heck.
  - **Staff Only:** Email Kevin at KEVIN.FINDER@STRIDECHC.ORG. Will get call back next day - MOMs+ to establish with Rebecca. Send referral information (clinical info from hospitalization) by email to Rebecca & Kevin directly: Rebecca.Heck@stridechc.org, KEVIN.FINDER@STRIDECHC.ORG
- **Program Information:** Rebecca Heck is a Certified Nurse Midwife who also provides Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) with Suboxone, Buprenorphine, and Naltrexone.
- **Wait Times:** Around 2 weeks for initial appointment to establish care
- **Insurance Accepted:** In network with most private payors/commercial insurance, Medicaid, Medicare, self pay rates available with sliding scale. Kaiser is out of network.
- **Additional Services Offered:**
  - Integrated behavioral health services - short term individual therapy, will refer out for more robust services needed (e.g., IOP, long term therapy).

- Pharmacy in-house at clinic
- Dental services available
- Family Medicine/Primary Care services available
- Pediatrics available
- Care navigation support
- Will have psychiatry available by January 2024

- Referral Process: Call 970.497.3333
- Program Information: River Valley is an FQHC with integrated behavioral health services including a MAT program for alcohol & opioids offering Suboxone/buprenorphine. They partner with Alpine Women’s Health for OB services.
- Wait times: Typically able to get in the next business day
- Insurances Accepted: All insurances except Kaiser, sliding scale fee for uninsured/indigent patients.
- Additional Services Offered: Case management services available along with primary care, therapy, and peer support services.

### **Traditional Outpatient**

- Referral Process: Call 719-473-5557, expect a call back or scheduled intake within 24 hours of first phone call.
- Program Information: Traditional outpatient therapy services available with no medications offered. HPP partners with Diversus or Peak Vista if the patient doesn’t have a PCP or wants MAT treatment.
- Wait times: Intake usually completed within 72 hours of first phone call
- Insurances Accepted: Medicaid

- Referral Process: Walk in same-day access Monday-Friday 8am-3pm for all intakes at 220 Ruskin Drive, Colorado Springs 80910. Once intake is complete, all SUD services will be 1795 Jetwing Drive and groups can be set up as early as the next day or individual counseling within 3 days.
- Program Information: Diversus offers primarily group-based therapy with individual counseling as needed in addition to offering Suboxone. They anticipate having their buprenorphine program up and running by December 2023.
- Wait times: Walk in same-day intakes for SUD

- Insurances Accepted: Medicaid (all RAE's), MSO/Signal funding for indigent patients. Will open up to private insurance by the end of 2023.
- Additional Services Offered:
  - Case management
  - Traditional Psychiatry
  - Peer support
  - Transportation to groups
